This would mean the class could commence on time, rather than waste time waiting for you to arrive.

Don't get a "PUP" – Avoid Internet Download Traps.

A Potential Unwanted Program- PUP- can get on to your computer usually by some action you took; or in other cases, such as where there was a choice of deselecting the unwanted program you did not take. When the download page of a sought program is opened it will very often have more than one clickable Download place, and all but one of them will be for some other program than the one wanted. If wrongly selected this will show in a small bar which opens at the bottom of Internet Explorer. Towards the right-hand end of this bar are boxes for Run, Save and Cancel. In the left section of the bar the name of the program is shown. Check this to see if this is the program that is wanted. Having downloaded the desired program the next step is to install it. Usually there will be a choice to Custom install, where any accompanied programs can be deselected. Use this, and only select what is required.

Even when doing a custom install there can still be ticked boxes for other programs appearing at various stages before installation actually begins. Unless these are wanted, uncheck all.

Removing PUPs can vary from straightforward to complicated - it depends. Try a Google search, or get help perhaps as is taught in some of the courses. A useful program is Malwarebytes. There is a free version.

But the preferred option – don't install them in the first place!
