HANDY HINT:

How to view more on your computer screen: To change the viewing size of your document or the pages in your browser, press and hold down the CTRL key and rotate the wheel on your mouse (if you have this type of mouse). Rolling it towards you reduces the page size (without reducing the actual font size). Rolling it away from you enlarges the view. In 'Word' this enables you to view multiple pages on the screen all at once.

LEARN PUBLISHER! Publisher is a program that you can use to make publications that combine text with pictures and drawings. With Publisher you can easily produce professional looking greeting cards, calendars, gift certificates, invitation cards, newsletters, brochures and anything else that combines text and pictures. Its use is limited only by your imagination. It is strongly recommended that you learn Publisher before commencing the graphics course. You can enrol in Publisher after you have completed the Basics course, although it would be advantageous if you have also completed the Working with Word course.

Publisher comes with Office Professional but not with Office Student edition. You should also be able to purchase Publisher by itself. The club may be able to assist you with obtaining Publisher for your computer if you do not have it installed.

Current courses cover Publisher 98 and Publisher 2000, but courses for Publisher 2003 and Publisher 2007 are available if there is sufficient demand for it. The next course will probably commence on the 3rd of February, 2009. You can book your place for that course on the notice board in the hall at the club.
