HOW MANY PASSWORDS DO WE NEED?

- User accounts require a user ID (often an email address) and a password
- This information is known at each end by the user and by the website server(s)
- Having different passwords for each site is hard to remember
- Having a single password for each site is easier but dangerous
- If one case of password leak occurs then all sites become at risk
- An optimum solution is use a password manager, then only one password must be remembered.
